## RAMROD'S MUSINGS

### From the Pokey December Match Observations

I noticed some issues that need discussing.

First, there are still shooters out there that have not blacked out the white diamond on their rear sight. If you don't black it out you'll get dinged at a bigger match.

Second, some of this past weekend's shooting scenarios caused the spotters headaches.

We've all done continuous Nevada sweeps forever, so placing a knockdown target in the center of one shouldn't cause problems, but it did.

When you have a sweep with a knockdown in it, count the sweep like there was no KD. At the end of the stage you'll know how many non KD targets were missed and the KD rack will show what was missed there. Easy, yes?

### Cowboy Logic Nelson Miles 1839-1925

For a decade and a half **Nelson Miles** was an efficient and relentless Native American fighter who successfully employed infantry in wars otherwise dominated by cavalry.

A tall, handsome officer, **Miles** was brave, aggressive, and well organized. But he also was vain, pompous, and ruthless in his personal ambitions. He acquired friends strictly for their value as contacts. He hated to give credit to other officers, and was deeply jealous of **West Point** graduates. **Miles** earned considerable enmity with his harsh criticisms of other officers, and throughout his career he was embroiled in one feud after another.

A 21-year-old Boston clerk when the Civil War erupted, **Miles** raised a troop of infantry. Bold and courageous, he was wounded four times, won the Medal of Honor, and vaulted in rank from lieutenant to major general of volunteers. In spite of his

self-promotion, **General Miles** distinguished himself in combat during the Civil War, the Indian Wars and the Spanish-American War.

Reduced to colonel after the Civil War, **Miles** was determined to reach the top of the frontier army. His 1868 marriage to **Mary Sherman**, niece of the army general and Ohio Senator **John Sherman**, gave him invaluable contacts.

In 1874 **General Sherman** assigned **Miles** to lead a column in the Red River War. In 1876 his command effectively pressured the victors over **George Armstrong Custer**'s 7th Cavalry. The next year Miles successfully intercepted **Chief Joseph's Nez Perce**. In 1878 Miles took time out from a vacation to skirmish with **Bannocks** and, two years later he was promoted to Brigadier General.

In 1886 **General Miles** engineered the final surrender of **Geronimo**.
